

## ORNEMENT

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The abstract floral richness of the Ornement décor captivates through its exceptional cross-stitch embroidery. This rendering of an 18th-century tapestry is revitalised on a luxurious, ultra-soft velour, adding depth and tactile allure to the design.

## BROCADE

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The Brocade décor is derived from an early 20th century textile. Its refined motif, rich in detail and texture, is revived on a luxurious jacquard fabric, preserving the grandeur and elegance of the original pattern.

## BOUQUET

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This beautiful décor, aptly named Bouquet, is designed after a historic tapestry from the Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam. The design comes to life on a slightly textured textile, whose airy, open weave lends the composition a calming and natural appearance.

## RIVERBANK

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This woven jacquard wallcovering depicts a lush riverbank where a Japanese crane, a rare species regarded as a symbol of good fortune, appears among the vegetation. The subtly pixelated drawing nods to the optimism of technological progress associated with mid-century Japanese aesthetics.

## RAMAGE

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In the world of textile design, a ramage denotes a motif of branches and flowers — an apt name for this décor in a Japanese drawing style, where birds of paradise hide playfully among lush foliage. The luxurious jacquard textile lends the composition a classical, enduring elegance.

## COLLINES

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The Collines décor is derived from an authentic 18th-century tapestry from Aubusson. Its abstract botanical motif is distinctly timeless, making it perfectly suited to contemporary interiors while preserving the charm of its historic origins.

## ESCAPADE

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The Escapade panorama, designed after a late-18th-century tapestry, evokes the atmosphere of a painted scene. It reveals a dreamy natural landscape that invites the viewer to wander and drift away, while the velvety-soft textile heightens the sense of luxury and elegance.

## FLORAISON

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With its ornate frame, *Floraison* recalls the character of a classical painting. It is designed after an original 18th-century tapestry from Aubusson, and the composition draws the viewer almost irresistibly into the scene. The panorama is executed on a parchment-like base, emphasising the authentic origin of the drawing.

## RÉCOLTE DES FLEURS

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The Récolte des Fleurs panorama, designed after an antique Beauvais tapestry, depicts a lively and joyful scene. The flower pickers celebrate life with an infectious energy that seems to radiate from the design. Rendered on a parchment-like base, the work glows like a precious artefact that has gracefully withstood the test of time.


